ACTION PLAN 2015-2106, REPORTING PERIOD JULY – DECEMBRE 2016

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1. INTRODUCTORY REMARKS

In the context of recent developments at the global level, i.e. the security challenges in the field of suppression of terrorism, money laundering and terrorist financing that many countries face, Montenegro continues to act preventively in this area. The National Inter-institutional Operational Team¹, established by the Bureau for Operational Coordination of the work of Security Services in accordance with the conclusions of the Government of Montenegro, monitors the implementation of the current Strategy for the Prevention and Suppression of Terrorism, Money Laundering and Terrorist Financing 2015-2018² and the Action Plan 2015- 2016³.

When establishing the Operational Team it was taken into account that it should consist of the representatives of relevant state authorities, such as: Special State Prosecutor's Office, High Court in Podgorica, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Interior and Police Directorate, Ministry of Defence and General Staff, National Security Agency, Administration for the Prevention of Money Laundering and Terrorist Financing, Directorate for the Protection of Classified Information, Tax Administration and Customs Administration.

In addition to the mentioned institutions, in the work of the Operational Team, the following agencies are involved indirectly: Insurance Supervisory Agency, Agency for Electronic Communications and Postal Services, Central Bank of Montenegro, Judicial Training Centre of Montenegro, Securities Commission, Ministry of Economy, Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism, Ministry of Transport and Maritime Affairs, Notary Chamber, Police Academy and the Administration for Inspection Affairs.

With a view to meet the obligation of biannual reporting to the Government of Montenegro on the implementation of the Strategy, the Operational Team has prepared the proposal of the XI Report, i.e. the final report on the implementation of the existing Strategy. The XI Report contains a detailed tabular review of the measures realized in the period July – December 2016, created upon the reports of individual reports of the state authorities recognized as reporting entities in relation to 22 objectives and 57 measures from the Action Plan 2015-2016.

Following the session held on 25 February 2017, the Operational Team defined the proposal for the XI Report on the implementation of the Action Plan for the Implementation of the Strategy for the Prevention and Combating of Terrorism, Money Laundering and Terrorist Financing, for the period July – December 2016.

2. IMPLEMENTATION LEVEL OF DUE MEASURES

2.1 Assertion

The Action Plan 2015-2016 for implementation of the Strategy contains **57 measures in total**, out of which 10 were completed in 2015 (the realization of one measure was postponed for the III quarter of 2016, (Objective 1, measure 1.3)); 9 measures are to be completed during 2016 and the realization of 38 measures is foreseen to be continually monitored.

Out of **47 measures** whose implementation was due in the reporting period July – December 2016, 38 measures have been continually monitored, while the implementation of 9 measures were planned to be completed at the end of 2016. The measures were completed systematically, except the measure 4.1. Signing of the Memorandum of Understanding between Ministry of Interior – Ministry of Defence – National Security Agency with the purpose of exchanging data, opinions, suggestions for establishing efficient counteracting terrorism and related criminal acts.

2.2 Assessment

The implementation the Action Plan 2015-2016 measures, for period July – December 2016, indicates the commitment of competent bodies for the implementation of established measures and goals, which is further strengthened by establishing an inter-institutional working group on expert-operational level. The establishment of this working group has contributed to the improvement of communication among the institutions responsible for the implementation of necessary measures. Quality coordination of the competent authorities at the operational level, i.e. their regular communication and harmonized activities in this extremely important security area has contributed to the implementation of the Action Plan 2015-2016. On session, held on 23 September 2015, the Operational Team adopted a Conclusion establishing a new inter-institutional working group on expert-operational level for the realization of measures 6.1 and 7.1.

2.3 Proposed measures for improvement

The Strategy is focused on further improving of the legislative framework, administrative and financial and technical capacity of relevant state authorities, keeping up with trends and new training programs and improvement in this area, more intensive cooperation of all relevant institutions in the country, the region and internationally, as well as awareness raising of the need for disabling propaganda and incitement to terrorism, and encouraging of terrorism in any way.

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Annex I

Activities of the Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism from the Action Plan 2015-2016 on the Implementation of the Strategy for Prevention and Suppression of Terrorism, Money Laundering and Terrorism Financing 2015-2018

In the nuclear safety area the cooperation at national, regional and international level is of great importance, in particular nowadays, when the world faces frequent terrorist attacks, including nuclear terrorism. In the period 29 August - 1 September 2016, there was an expert mission in cooperation of the Department of Nuclear Safety and Security of the International Atomic Energy Agency and the Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism. The goal of the mission was the revision of the existing and creation of the new Integrated Nuclear Security Support Plan (INSSP), as well as the implementing Action Plan for the period 2017- 2019. Special accent was given to the legal/regulatory infrastructure from nuclear safety area, prevention (including system of threats and safety of radioactive sources), detection and sustainability of the nuclear safety system in Montenegro, as well as providing information by the experts of the International Atomic Energy Agency on the options for support to Montenegro in the forthcoming period. Besides the organizer representatives, in this mission participated 22 representatives of Montenegrin relevant institutions, as follows: Ministry of Interior, Police Directorate, Forensic Centre, National Security Agency, National Security Council, Customs Administration, Ministry for Information Society and Telecommunications, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and European Integration, Ministry of Defense, Ministry of Science, Faculty of Natural Sciences and Mathematic, D.O.O. „ Centre for Ecotoxicological Research “, A.D. Institute of black metallurgy, Clinical Centre Montenegro. During this important expert mission, there were identified certain deficiencies and proposals for their removal were made. Also, the proposal of the Action Plan for the implementation of Integrated Nuclear Security Support Plan (INSSP), covering a three-year period 2017-2019, was made. The proposal has to be harmonized with MAAE by the end of the first quarter of 2017.

At its session held on 29 December 2016, the Government of Montenegro, upon the proposal of the Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism, in accordance with the Work program of the Government of Montenegro for 2016 and Montenegro's Programme of Accession to the European Union for period 2016-2018 (PPCG 2016-2018), adopted the Strategy on Ionizing Radiation Protection, Radiation Safety and Radioactive Waste Management for period 2017-2021 with the Action Plan for period 2017-2021. In the process of drafting this comprehensive document, in accordance with the Regulation on the procedure and manner of conducting public discussion in the preparation of law (“Official Gazette of Montenegro”, number 12/12), a 40-day public discussion was held. The Strategy was made on the basis of analysis of the Strategy for period 2012-2016, taking into account new international standards requests and unrealized measures that are clearly stated and described in the Second report on implementation of the Strategy on Ionizing Radiation Protection, Radiation Safety and Radioactive Waste Management, adopted by the Government of Montenegro at the session held on 17.12.2015. The Strategy was developed through cooperation of the representatives of the Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism and experts of the International Atomic Energy Agency, while the analysis was conducted by the representatives of the Institute for radioelements of the Kingdom of Belgium.

Led by the analysis of the results achieved so far and requests set before Montenegro, as well as by challenges in the area of ionizing radiation protection, radiation safety and radioactive waste management, the Strategy covers 25 chapters and it gives

strategic guidelines in the Action Plan. For the first time it included, among others, the area of **nuclear safety and nuclear culture**. Special accent is given to the development of the National detection program that is to be drafted in the first quarter of 2018. The Strategy emphasizes for the first time the updating of the Integrated Nuclear Security Support Plan (INSSP) for period 2017-2019 and development of the implementing Action Plan, as well as the need of establishing the Working body for monitoring the implementation of that Action Plan.

The Government of Montenegro, upon the proposal of the Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism, at its session held on 10.11.2016 considered and defined the **Proposal of the Law on ratifying the Agreement between the European Atomic Energy Community (EURATOM) and non-member states of the European Union on the on the participation of the latter in the Community arrangements for the early exchange of information in the event of radiological emergency (ECURIE)**, which has been submitted for parliamentary procedure.

Within the implementation of the Law on ratifying the Agreement between Montenegro and International Atomic Energy Agency on the implementation of safeguard measures in relation to the non-proliferation of nuclear weapon, Additional Protocol to the Agreement between Montenegro and International Atomic Energy Agency in relation to the Contract on non-proliferation of nuclear weapon and Protocol to the Agreement between Montenegro and International Atomic Energy Agency on the implementation of safeguard measures in relation to the Contract on non-proliferation of nuclear weapon („Official Gazette of Montenegro – International treaties”, No.16/10 dd 28. 12. 2010), Montenegro, in accordance with the Law's provisions, has created so far **18 national reports and it delivered the statements on nuclear materials** to the International Atomic Energy Agency. In 2016 the Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism created four (4) reports and delivered them to the International Atomic Energy Agency.

Annex II:

Information on the application of measures for disabling propaganda and calling for terrorism

Terrorism, money laundering and terrorist activities financing may endanger the government, security and economic interests which, among other things, means a stable constitutional order, rule of law, democracy development, strengthening of peace and stability as prerequisites for the development of society, financially strong economic sector, stable financial system, fair and free labour market and a functioning market economy. These phenomena can also endanger all social structures.

The general framework of action and response of Montenegro to current and future challenges and threats is given through the Strategy for Prevention and Suppression of Terrorism, Money Laundering and Terrorism Financing adopted by the Government of Montenegro. The basic goal of the Strategy is determination of priorities based on the need to develop efficient and functional mechanisms of relevant institutions and improving procedures of prevention and suppression of terrorism, money laundering and terrorist financing. The Strategy shows the commitment of Montenegro to, through European and Euro-Atlantic integration act jointly with other countries and international organizations, with the goal to strengthen national, regional and global safety.

Areas of activities

All activities regarding terrorism and violent extremism are developed through time and represent potential danger to our country. Detecting groups susceptible to radicalization and extremism is getting harder due to wide use and availability of internet.

Aside from that, any possible departure of our citizens for participating in battles that are in areas of armed conflict, and their process of radicalization and return, may represent danger for our safety.

With the goal to protect its citizens from the threats of extremism, radicalism and terrorism, Montenegro, with strong partner cooperation on national, regional and international level, recognizes areas of activities:

- development of national Strategy, complied with the real condition and international documents, primarily with the Strategy EU in the fight against terrorism, Strategy for the prevention of radicalization and recruitment of terrorists and UN Global Counter - Terrorism Strategy, establishing appropriate institutional framework of security services, law enforcement agencies, experts in that area, in order to plan measures easily for the successful prevention of violent extremism and terrorism;
- training of employees working with individuals and groups exposed to risk, not only for the employees working with law enforcement agencies but for social, educational and health care workers, in order to understand better the process of radicalization and reaction to it;

- accepting knowledge, experiences and best practices with the goal to create preventive measures and development of support programs for the members of extremist groups for the abandonment of such groups and deradicalization, which is best achieved by cooperation of more subjects from various sectors, especially family and members of community close to violent extremists;
- cooperation with civil society and private sector for the solution of problems encountered on the Internet. Efforts must not stop on the prohibition of material, but include messages of opposite content in order to undermine extremist arguments;
- support critical thinking among young people about extremist messages. Education, with which young people can be helped in critical thinking about extremist opinions and messages and discover deficiency of such propaganda;
- intensification of research about trends of radicalization – how and why do people become more or less radical, and on the role which they have in this sense, ideology, techniques of recruitment with the help of internet or role models.

With the goal to prevent terrorist radicalization and recruitment, Montenegro will act in three key areas:

- prevent activities of individuals and networks which lead people in terrorism
- provide that moderate opinions are heard louder than extremists
- promote safety, justice, democracy and possibilities for all more intensive.

The influence of the media

Terrorism and terrorist acts will always be a strong form of propaganda and will attract media attention. The desire of the media to raise their ratings can provide terrorist groups to deliver desired messages.

Certainly, reporting about terrorist activities cannot be and should not be interrupted, but it is very important to direct media to possibilities of so-called media fight against terrorism. In this sense, it is necessary to show the public a wider range of terrorism backgrounds and its negative sides which, with the use of violence, achieves certain political goal.

By directing public opinion towards disapproval and withholding support to terrorist acts in all spheres, the purpose of media fight against terrorism is fulfilled.

In the context of the above stated, these activities include coordinated action of all participants, primarily at the national level, included in the fight against terrorism because it is a key condition for efficient prevention and suppression of socially dangerous phenomenon of extremism, radicalism which may lead to terrorism, and in that way realize the **vision**:

Montenegro has coordinated and efficient system for the prevention of terrorism, which was based on international standards and cooperation between competent authorities on national, regional and international level.
